**Saturday 9<sup>th</sup>** – 25m Centre Fire Pistol, 25m Pistol Men's, 10m Women's Air Pistol, 10m Junior Women's Air Pistol  
**Sunday 10<sup>th</sup>** – 25m Standard Pistol

**Finals:** Finals will be shot for all Olympic events. Check for notification on the day.

**50m Pistol:** 50m Pistol will be shot two targets side by side. Preparation and Sighting in 15 minutes, 1st & 2nd cards in 30 minutes, 3rd & 4th cards in 30 minutes, 5th & 6th cards in 30 minutes.

**25m Matches:** Will be scored on range after each 5 shot series.

**10m Air Pistol:** One pellet per scoring target.

**Junior Matches:** 10m Junior Men's Air, 10m Junior Women's Air and 25m Pistol Junior. Juniors may enter both Open and Junior matches. They will only shoot once, with their one score being used to determine results in their selected match or matches.

**Equipment Control:** Full equipment control will be available prior to shooting and random equipment checking after shooting.

**Coral Sea Pistol Championships:** are open to competitors from the following countries: Fiji, Guam, New Caledonia, Norfolk Island, Papa New Guinea and Tahiti.

**Coral Sea Pistol Championship Matches:** will run concurrently with Pistol New Zealand matches.

**Trophies:** If you have trophies for this competition, please see that they are engraved and returned in time for presentation.

**Lunches:** Lunch options available at the clubrooms.

**Tea and Coffee:** Is provided free of charge.

**Presentation** of medals will take place after each event is finished or/and at the dinner on Saturday night.

**Saturday Dinner:** There will be a prize giving dinner at the shooting complex on Saturday night 9th March. Cost is \$35 per head.

# PISTOL NEW ZEALAND

MEMBER OF THE NZ COUNCIL OF LICENCED FIREARMS OWNERS (COLFO)

## Conditions of Entry

### 1) Firearms Licence Requirement

It is a condition of participation in this event that:

- If you are over 16 years of age, you are the holder of a current New Zealand Firearms Licence
- If you are under 16 years of age, you are accompanied by and will be participating under the supervision of a holder of a current New Zealand Firearms Licence.

In either case, either a standard or a visitor's Firearms Licence is acceptable.

At the registration for this event you (or your supervisor, if you are under 16 years of age) will be required to produce your Firearms Licence. If you do not do so, you will be unable to participate in the event"

### 2) Refusal of a participant's entry to an event

The following is a suggested procedure that must be added to an entry form under 'conditions of entry':

If the club receives a complaint in writing on any matter that relates to entry of a match, the club committee will:

1. Establish the seriousness and validity of the complaint, and will assign a match sub-Committee to further investigate the complaint and report back.
2. If valid and reasonable, the committee will write to the person outlining details of the rejection of entry, who, what, why, when, and how, and produce any evidence received or any investigation report made. This will occur with 48 hours of their entry being received.
3. The letter will indicate any breaches of the club rules and give them a copy of those rules.
4. The club committee will ask for a response in writing within 5 days (and no later than 48 hours before the start of the match) and/or to appear in person in front of the match committee to answer the allegations made. The letter will indicate that if no response is received within 5 days (and no later than 48 hours before the start of the match) then the match committee will make a decision based on the evidence it has before it.
5. The match committee will then make a decision citing reasons and an assessment of the evidence before it, referring both to the complaint and any explanation from the affected person and send this decision in writing back to the affected person.
6. The person affected will have a right of appeal to have the matter reviewed by an independent person assigned from another club if needed.
7. The decision will have reasons as to why the person is being excluded from the event and this decision will then be final. Should the decision be made that the person can partake of the event

then no late entry fees will be charged. The participant will have a minimum of 48 hours' notice that they may attend the event.

*Note to the above process:*

Complaints cannot be anonymous, unless very good reasons are given to the match committee for the identity of the complainant to be kept private.

In order for this process of natural justice to occur all competitions need to have a minimum close off date of at least 2 weeks prior to the start of the competition/event. If an organizing committee do not wish to have a closing date or decide to accept any late entries after the two week cutoff then they must accept all entrants.

If the event can only host a maximum number of entries this must be pre-advertised as per the competition entry form. Exceeding the maximum number of entries can only be used as a reason if this is the case.

### 1. Visitors Firearms License and Permit to Import firearms Procedure:

All visitors bringing in firearms must fill out the Police Visitors Firearms application below.

This needs to be filled out even if you are not bringing in firearms but intend shooting firearms in New Zealand.

**Online via NZ Police website:**

#### **Secure online application**

##### **Notes:**

You don't need to include a copy of your firearms license with this application but have to have your firearms license on you (If applicable) when you enter and are in possession of firearms while in New Zealand.

You will need a **New Zealand License Holder's address and Firearms License Number** to complete the above NZ Police form.

You must have this temporary NZ firearms license to shoot in New Zealand even though you may not be bringing firearms with you. The NZ Police do not communicate with you about whether there is an issue or not. Pistol NZ no longer advises the Airport Police of incoming shooters. When the Police issue the Import Permit they will advise the Airport Police themselves of your pending arrival.

**IMPORTANT NOTE: The Police have stated that they have three weeks to process any online applications. If you send in your application inside three weeks the application may NOT BE APPROVED in time for your arrival! To be certain of your permit make sure you place your application BEFORE three weeks from the first day of the event.**

### 2. Registration for the event:

The Police will be seeking verification from Pistol NZ that the incoming shooter is coming for a legitimate competition. **PNZ needs to receive your Event registration form before you send your visitors firearms license application to the NZ Police.**

### 3. MFAT Export of Strategic Goods form

Changes in exportation laws now require approval for you to export your firearms (to yourself). You need to complete the form highlighted **and** include with it a copy of the Import Permit you obtain from your own country. In the case of Australia we know this to be the B709a.

**NOTE: This only applies if you are bringing in our leaving with 5 OR MORE firearms.**

##### **Membership of your home organisation**

PNZ requires that you are a member in good standing and belong to your National association before shooting at matches at Pistol New Zealand events. The PNZ IPSC Nationals will be asking for verification from your National associations that this is the case and it will be a requirement for your participation at this match.
